
### About Girlguiding Scotland

Girlguiding Scotland is the leading charity for girls and young women in Scotland. Thanks to the dedication and support of 11,500 amazing volunteers, we are active in every part of the Scotland. We give girls and young women a space where they can be themselves, have fun, build brilliant friendships, gain valuable life skills and make a positive difference to their lives and their communities.

We are currently delivering our <u>2019-2021 strategy</u>, which focuses on improving access to guiding, delivering excellence through our programme, incorporating girls voices into our work and improving our capacity to deliver for girls and young women. These areas of focus guide all aspects of our work. Over the coming year we will also be aligning our strategy with the new Girlguiding strategy, which launched in March 2020. The Girlguiding strategy focuses on creating exceptional experiences for girls, developing a rewarding experience for volunteers, becoming more inclusive and expanding our impact.

The Communications Committee makes sure that Girlguiding Scotland is proactively promoted externally across Scotland by providing support to counties to do this locally.

The Committee maintains channels for effective internal communications with members and ensures that young members' voices are heard internally and externally across Scotland on matters important to them. The successful candidate will help support the planning process to drive and deliver Girlguiding Scotland's vision. This is a significant Trustee role which celebrates Scottish guiding's positive impact on society.

#### Role

In partnership with the Communications Manager you'll:

- Champion effective internal and external communications as a key priority for Girlguiding Scotland and follow strategic direction given by the Trustees
- Inspire and proactively manage the volunteer members of the Communications
  Committee and the projects they undertake
- Provide leadership and guidance, and develop effective working relationships with county commissioners and their local volunteer teams to provide support and practical help
- Ensure that Girlguiding Scotland is a platform for girls' voices to be heard at all levels about matters that are important to them
- Work with the senior volunteers and staff to ensure that communication and promotion of Girlguiding Scotland is embedded in all that we do

#### Term of Office

The Lead Volunteer for the Communications team is appointed for an initial period of 3 years with an extension of 2 years if mutually agreed.

#### Who can do this role

The Lead Volunteer for Communications can be any adult member age 18+ who is also eligible to be a Trustee of Girlguiding Scotland.



#### Responsible to

The Lead Volunteer for Communications is a Trustee role, appointed by and responsible to the Scottish Chief Commissioner.

You will work closely with:

- The Girlguiding Scotland Executive Committee

#### Personal qualities

- Strong understanding of Girlguiding Scotland's values, aims and objectives as defined in our strategy
- Ability to inspire and engage others to ensure that communication and promotion is embedded across all teams
- Approachable, creative, open minded and flexible
- Articulate and confident speaking to others in a 1-2-1 situation, remotely and in a group setting
- Effective written communication skills and knowledge and ability to use social media
- Able to lead and work as part of a team
- Able to work with information of a confidential or sensitive nature
- Good organisational skills
- Diplomatic and able to handle difficult conversations with tact

An understanding of/previous experience working with communications is desirable.



#### Responsibilities

- Provide vision and leadership to deliver effective external promotion of Girlguiding Scotland and Girlguiding
- Work in partnership with the manager to prepare proposals, reports and budgets for submission to the executive committee
- Inspire and proactively manage teams of volunteers involved with internal and external communications, and with championing the youth voice
- Maintain close contact with volunteer and staff members of the communications team
- Foster close working relationships with other Lead Volunteers to ensure communication requirements for all projects are understood and embedded from conception
- Proactive member of the Scottish Executive and a Trustee for Girlguiding Scotland
- Proactive member of the Senior Leadership Team
- Become a member of Girlguiding volunteer communications network

#### **Meetings**

You will actively engaged in the following:

- Girlguiding Scotland Trustee meetings
- Convening and chairing meetings of the Communications Committee
- Meeting with the Communications Manager
- Senior Leadership Team meetings
- Represent Scotland in relevant Girlguiding networks

#### Time commitment

The Lead Volunteer role will involve a significant amount of time in the evening and at weekends. It is important that this would be the primary guiding appointment for the post holder during their term of office.

#### What you'll get from the role

In addition to helping shape the work of Girlguiding Scotland, you will have access to relevant training opportunities and the chance to participate in external events with other voluntary sector or youth work organisations. You'll have a chance to develop your transferable skills through:



- Partnership working with staff and senior volunteers
- Managing teams and projects
- Stakeholder communication and engagement
- Budget setting and monitoring
- Engaging with other third sector organisations
- Learning from other countries and regions
- Writing and reviewing reports
- Strategic development and planning

Through all of this you will have the support of the senior volunteer team and your staff partner.
