In Summer 2020, Girlguiding Scotland adopted the Girlguiding strategy **'Today, Tomorrow, Together'.** We planned our work around its four themes.




The themes are:

- Sustainable and efficient organisation



This role

This role is part of the Awards working group, which focuses on promoting all Girlguiding and Girlguiding Scotland awards and to encourage members at all levels to make nominations. It is led by the Chair of the Scottish Awards committee, Carol Morwood. This role will be supported by other members of the Awards working group and staff at Girlguiding Scotland.

Your profile:

- Highly enthusiastic with the ability to engage, inspire and motivate others
- Articulate and confident when speaking to others in a 1-2-1 and group setting whether face to face or remotely
- Approachable, open minded and flexible
- Organised and able to analyse large quantities of written information and match information to given criteria
- Able to work as part of a decision-making team
