

Cityscapes Adventures

Girlguiding Scotland are delighted to be part of Cityscapes Adventure, a 1-day wide game taking place in 5 cities across the UK. Glasgow is a host city, welcoming members from across the country on 21 March 2026.



Team tasks

We are looking for enthusiastic individuals to join the team delivering this exciting event. There are some set roles we would like to recruit people into, but you may be asked to do other things as needed. The roles are:

- **Activity station volunteers**

- Supporting the activity providers at each station (there will be 10 in total)
- Welcoming groups as they arrive
- Advise on likely time to complete activity, potential wait if the station is busy, and directing groups to other nearby activities (maps will be provided)
- Escalate any issues to the lead team
- We anticipate needing 2 people per station for this role to cover breaks

- **Meet and greet volunteers**

- You will be based at the train and bus stations in Glasgow
- Act as a welcome to groups coming in and direct them towards the nearest activity stations (maps will be provided)
- Escalate any issues to the lead team
- This will involve an earlier start and, once the game is underway, you will act as floating cover, ensuring breaks can be taken at busy stations
- We anticipate needing 6 people for this role, 2 per station

- **First aiders**

- While individual groups will be responsible for their own first aid, we want to recruit 2 qualified first aiders to the event volunteer team to provide additional cover if required
- You will need to have a recognised first aid qualification such as The British Red Cross or St Andrew's First Aid in addition to Girlguiding first response
- You should provide your own first aid kit and you will be reimbursed for any supplies used
- You will be out and about throughout the event, moving between stations
- You will escalate any issues encountered to the lead team

It will be a very busy day which may be physically demanding. Some of the roles will require you to be outdoors a lot, on your feet for most of the day and walking a lot.

Please think about whether you feel this is manageable and, more importantly, enjoyable for you!

Time commitment

Team members would need to be available to arrive in Glasgow City Centre for 8am. The game runs until 4pm and then we will need to pack up.

The proposed itinerary is as follows:

- Saturday morning – arrive early in city centre (location tbc) for final event briefing, then head to activity stations or train and bus stations
- Saturday afternoon – once the game ends, activity stations will be packed up and any equipment loaded up to go back to SHQ

Prior to the event, we would like to have a welcome and icebreaker event online to introduce ourselves and get to know you, with a follow up online meeting prior to the event.

We also intend to have a WhatsApp community to allow discussions between you all which will be live from our first online meeting until after the evaluation from the event is completed. This WhatsApp community will be used to keep in touch with everyone during the event and will be used to broadcast any important information, so you must be comfortable being part of it.

Skills needed

- Communication
- Time management
- Organisation
- Adaptability
- Friendly
- Approachable

You must also have a valid PVG in place, safer guiding and be a member of Girlguiding Scotland or the Trefoil Guild up to and including the full duration of the event.

You will need to commit to the itinerary above, to following instructions from the lead team, and remember that you are representing Girlguiding Scotland for the duration of the event and must behave accordingly.

Expenses

We will pay reasonable travel expenses and cover lunch on the day of the event. Accommodation may be provided, on a bed and breakfast, shared room basis, for those volunteers who live more than an hour away from Glasgow or where you have an additional support need.
